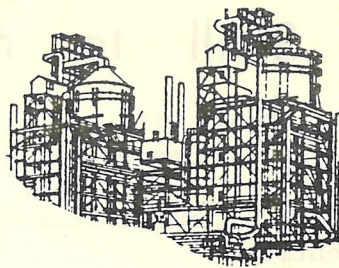

Shell to market nonleaded gasoline

Shell will begin marketing a new, nonleaded gasoline in the fall of this year, President Denis Kemball-Cook said recently.

"We are taking this step because we now expect many, if not most, of the 1971 model cars will be able to use such a gasoline effectively. We think our action supports President Nixon's confidence that the petroleum industry would make a available suitable nonleaded gasolines for these new cars," Kemball-Cook said.

Lead compounds have been added to gasoline since the 1920's as the most economical way to raise their octane level

to that required by most of today's high compression automobile engines. However, it now appears to be the view of certain automotive manufacturers that lead affects adversely their efforts to limit unburned gasoline, carbon monoxide, and other emissions in the auto exhaust.

"Accordingly, we expect to manufacture a new nonleaded gasoline designed for the new 1971 cars. Facilities needed to market this product will require a substantial investment this year," Kemball-Cook said.

"We will continue to market our two grades of leaded gasolines because most of the cars produced up until now require them."
